

## Creative Commons

*A Creative Commons license is one of several copyright licenses that allow the free distribution of an otherwise copyrighted "work".*



### **CC-BY:**

By Attribution, which permits sharing and reuse of the material, for any purpose, as long as the original authors are credited.



### **CC-BY-ND:**

The No Derivatives clause prevents anyone from producing a modified version of a work, whilst fully allowing sharing.



### **CC-BY-NC:**

The Non Commercial clause specifically prevents the reuse of material for commercial purposes.



### **CC-BY-SA:**

By Attribution, with a Share-Alike clause which means that anyone sharing or modifying the original work must release it under the same license.



### **CC-BY-NC-ND:**

Prevents commercial use and non-commercial users may only share, not modify, the material



### **CC-BY-NC-SA:**

Non Commercial and Share-Alike clauses ensure any derivative material must also be shared under a Non-Commercial license.



### **CC-0:**

Waves all rights and releases work to the public domain. Creative Commons Zero (CC0) is for dedicating works to the public domain. It works on two levels: as a waiver of a person's rights to the work, and in case that is not effective, as an irrevocable, royalty-free, and unconditional license for anyone to use the work for any purpose. The rights waived include database rights, so CC0 is suitable for use with data
